Soon we will start the new year and before we know it, we will be joining together for our state convention. As the Ceremonial Chair, I wanted to give you some thoughts regarding the new Initiation Ceremony. All auxiliaries have received the new program and can hold this ceremony and bring your new members to full membership of the order. The ceremony is very easy to exemplify. If you would like to host an Initiation Ceremony at your auxiliary or chapter, please reach out to one of the regional District Deputies in your Chapter or contact the State Vice President Fran Corcione or myself for assistance. Please remember that this new ceremony takes the place of the previous First and Major Degree. When a candidate witnesses this ceremony, they are full members. You will only need to send the A100 application with the fee of \$5 per member to the Supreme Secretary within 10 days of the exemplification of the ceremony. Also, if you have members who previously only completed the First Degree, they too can witness this Initiation Ceremony and that will fulfill the obligation previously required to witness the Major Degree. With these members advancing to full members, you DO NOT send the A100 or monies to Supreme. Your Financial Secretary will just need to update the Supreme Membership Portal with the date of the ceremony.

As the Humanitarian Award Chair, on behalf of State President Nadine, I look forward the many submissions from each auxiliary. I am confident

that each of you knows of a special, deserving individual that you can nominate for this award. Reach out to your pastor, community leaders, etc. and ask if they know someone who stands out and is deserving of this recognition. It could be anyone who is serving the community and touching people's lives in a charitable way. It is through their time and talent that the lives of others are improved. Each auxiliary is eligible to submit one nominee for this award. The NJ Prestigious Past State Presidents are anxious to read the submission letters and biographies and choose the most deserving humanitarian.

Did you know that the New Jersey State Council Columbiettes has a Greeting Card program? All proceeds are donated to our Seminarians and Postulants in June at convention.

Who can request a card?

Anyone! Columbiette members, Officers, District Deputies, and non-Columbiettes alike.

What type of cards are available?

There are 2 types of cards: Folded greeting cards and business card enclosures (a business card size printed on both sides that can be inserted into your own store-bought greeting card). A sample of the business card was provided at the Officer Seminar.

What kind of cards can be requested?

The greeting cards have this year's 'Women of God' theme on the front. Cards and business cards can be created for all occasions. Thank You, Get Well, Congratulations, Thinking of You, Sympathy, Birthday, whatever your need may be. You can provide me with the verse that you want written on the card, or I will write a custom message from you.

How is a card requested?

Send me an email, text, call, or letter. Your request should include who the card is being sent to (along with their address if it is not in the State Columbiette directory), who it is from, and what kind of card you want.

How long does it take for the card to get sent out?

I will mail the completed card within 48 hours of your request using your return address or I can deliver it to you.

How much does it cost?

The suggested donation is \$5.00 per card (including postage) but any amount is gratefully accepted.

How do we pay?

You can request the cards today and pay for them tomorrow, I keep track of all requests and payments. You can mail a check made payable to "NJSCC" to me and I will forward it to the State Financial Secretary.

NOW ACCEPTING REQUESTS FOR CHRISTMAS CARDS! It's not too early to order those cards for your Chaplain, District Deputy, or whoever you want and check an item off your to-do list! These can be sent to the recipient or to you for presentation.

For Christmas, we will be collecting pajamas for women and children at Safe + Sound, an organization that provides support to survivors of


domestic abuse as well as coloring books and crayons to donate to the Children's Hospital at St. Peter's University Hospital in New Brunswick.


